








Welcome




Gluepot Reserve exists for the protection of all biota, not just birds

Introduction of a 'Judas Goat' program

Enables us to track and remove mobs of goats via satellite transmitter collars placed on nannies. The collars are also utilised for research purposes





Electrification of the 36 km north boundary fence was completed in 2012 and monitoring of this fenceline has proved that electrification is very successful in keeping goats out of Gluepot.

In 2013 we built a new electrified goat proof fence on the Reserve's 12 km western boundary



Fox baiting is undertaken six times per year at almost 100 sites

Two follow-ups are done after each baiting.

We are currently installing 200 new 1080 bait ejector systems in addition to meat baiting.



19 universities & Research Institutes participate, including a number of overseas universities – eg: University of New Mexico & Wisconsin University.






























Gluepot Reserve – a national leader in sustainability

- POWER (self-sufficient): largest self contained solar power system in the Riverland
 - WATER (self-sufficient): 80,000+ gallons of rainwater plus dam water
- WASTE MANAGEMENT: A leader in re-cycling and reuse of almost all materials (we are known as the 'Steptoe & Son of the North'
 - Gluepot Reserve was described by one of Australia's leading ABC journalist as "one of the conservation miracles of the 21st century"


